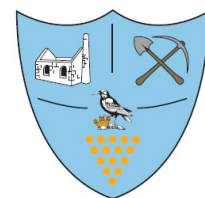

Do you have a child born **between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018?**

If so, you will need to apply for a place in a reception class in September 2022 for that child by the deadline of **15 January 2022**.

Please note: you will need to apply even if your child attends a school's nursery or pre-school class. If a school is oversubscribed the fact that a child attends a school's nursery or pre-school, or a local nursery or pre-school, does not automatically guarantee a place at that school. Year 3

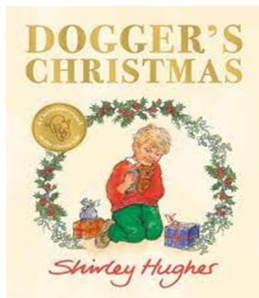

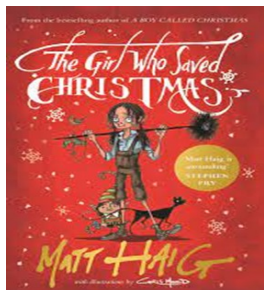


KS1 Book of the Week - Dogger's Christmas
