Title: Brother Eagle, Sister Sky **Author:** Susan Jeffers **Book Level:** 4.4

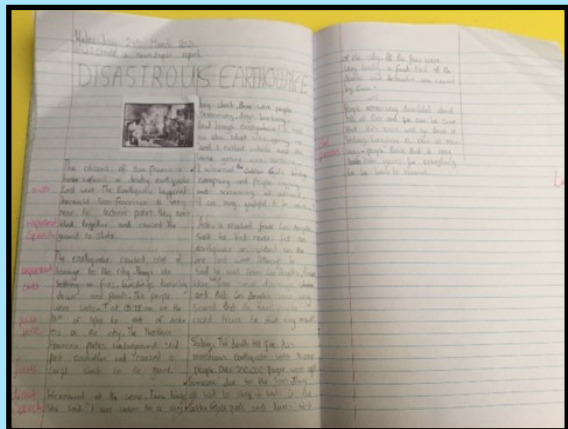



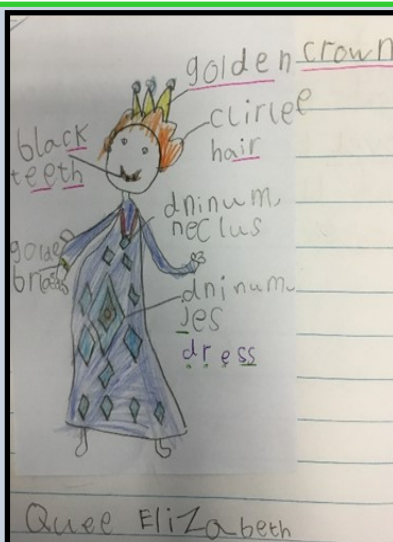
