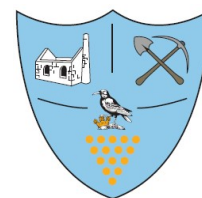

## **Did you know? Going, Going, Gone!!**

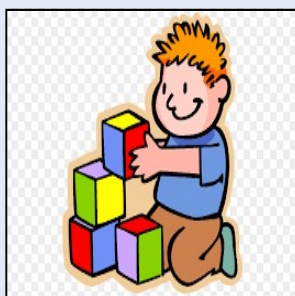

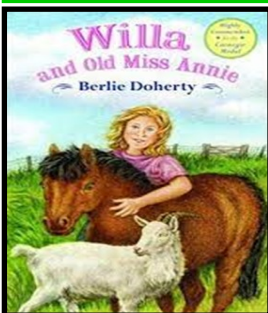

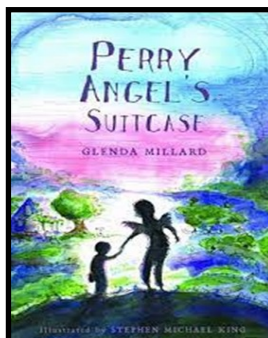

## Parent Governor Vacancy

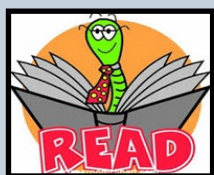
