This week's book of the week was 'Wild' (FS1/FS2/KS1) and 'Croc and Bird' (KS2).


Thank you again to everybody who responded to my challenge this week. I really appreciate the entries we receive.





Pupils have been using a variety of materials to design and create their own lava lamps in a bottle!


They have also been experimenting with oil pastels and watercolours to create a polar themed painting.
