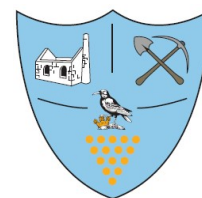

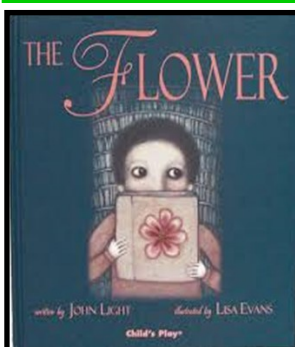

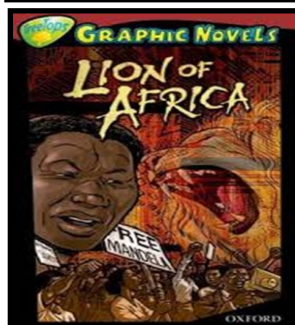
KS1 Book of the Week

Book Level: 3.5

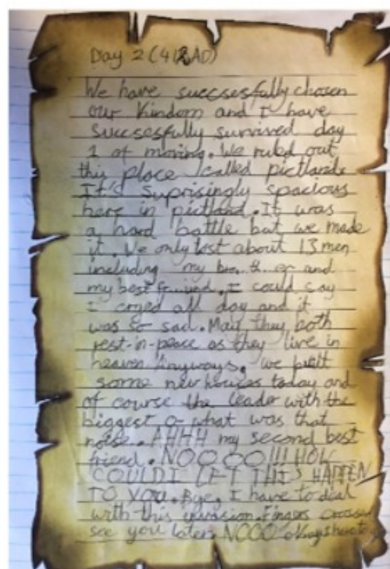
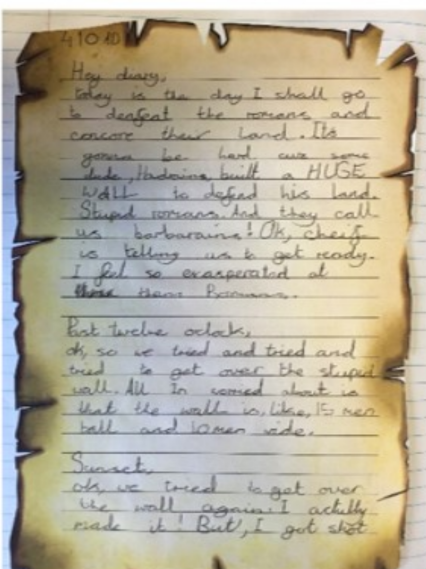

The Year Ones have been very interested in learning about why he was significant and they have done some amazing writing! Well done. Year One! You are all superstars!



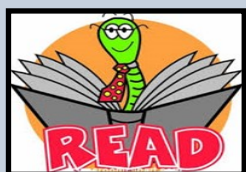
