Message from Miss Furnish

I can't believe we are already at the end of week two. This week the children have been settling into their new learning and should you wish to find out more about what they are learning please take a look on the school website, where you can find information around this half term's focus for your child's year group.

At the start of every year we review our behaviour policy and this year we decided to raise the profile of our 'Golden Rules'. We have introduced golden house points which the children can earn when they demonstrate one or more of the rules. Already this week I have seen a number of children being rewarded for being 'golden' and following the 'Golden Rules'. We have also reinstated sending home a red card to let parents and carers know when their child has broken one of the rules and made a poor behaviour choice. I am pleased to say that these are given out very rarely but we do ask that if you receive one you work with us and take time at home to talk with your child regarding the 'Golden Rules' and what choice to make next time.

On Friday we will be holding our start of year parent/teacher meetings and we always find these an invaluable start to the year. Due to high COVID cases in Cornwall we will be holding these over the telephone rather than in person. If you have not had a chance to book up it's not too late.

I sign off this week by thanking you, the children and staff for another positive week of learning. Take care and stay safe.

the mirrors to make sure we select the right skin tone, eye


and hair colour to perfectly show ourselves in our fantastic artwork. We hope you like our marvellous artwork!





This week St Blazey Class (and the rest of Year 5) researched the Polar Regions; in particular the differences between the Arctic and Antarctic.


