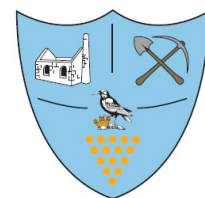

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - TRAINING DAY

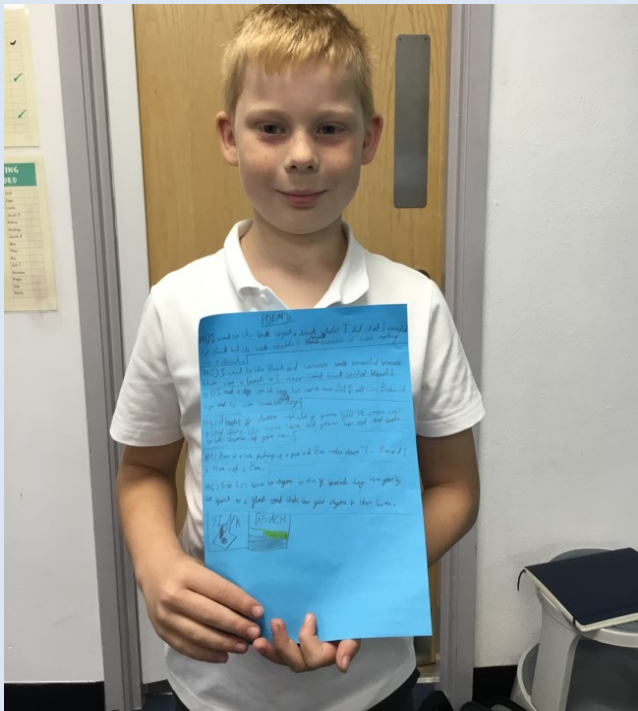

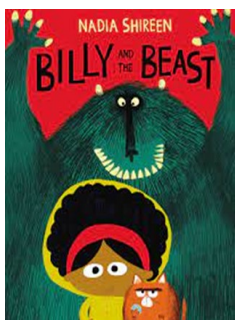

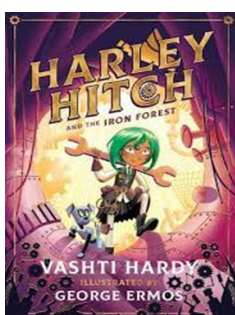
KS1 Book of the Week

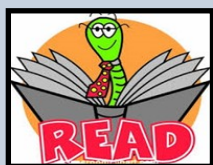

In Year 4 this week the children have been learning all about their environment through science.

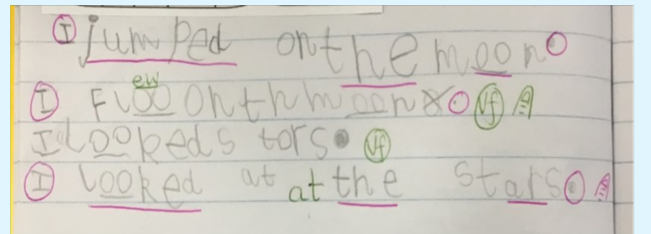
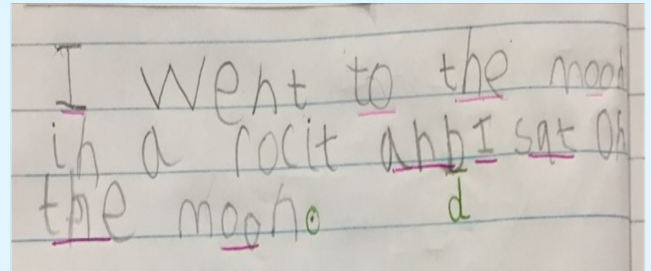
We have been learning about classification so we have been outside collecting and classifying leaves that grow in our locality.
