<u>Year 1</u>	Autumn 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The creation story is the first story in The Bible.</li> <li>• Christians say thank you to God by saying 'grace' before meals.</li> <li>• Christians are grateful that God created the world and show thanks by giving to people with less.</li> </ul>
	Autumn 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Christmas is important to Christians because they believe Jesus was the son of God.</li> <li>• Christmas is not just celebrated by Christians.</li> <li>• Christians prepare for Christmas during 'advent' when they prepare for Jesus' arrival.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A parable is a story from the Bible.</li> <li>• Christians believe that God is loving and forgiving.</li> <li>• Some Christians pray to say thank you, ask for something, praise God and say sorry.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2 and Summer 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Shema is a Jewish prayer.</li> <li>• A Jewish home may contain special objects e.g. kippah, candlesticks and a mezuzah.</li> <li>• Shabbat is a Jewish festival.</li> <li>• The stories in the Tenakh teach Jewish people about God looking after his people.</li> </ul>

<u>Year 2</u>	Autumn 1 and Autumn 2 - Islam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Muslims believe in Allah and follow Islam.</li> <li>The Qur'an is an important book in Islam.</li> <li>Muslims have 99 names to describe Allah.</li> <li>Muhammad is the messenger of God.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1 - Gospel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Bible contains stories about God.</li> <li>All Christians follow the teachings about forgiveness and peace.</li> <li>Confession is a sacrament for Christians.</li> <li>Christians share Jesus' good news to others.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2 - Easter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Holy week takes place between Palm Sunday and Easter.</li> <li>Easter eggs represent new life.</li> <li>Christians believe that Jesus died on the cross and rose again.</li> </ul>
	Summer 1 - Cornwall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sacred means to be holy and have a special connection with God.</li> <li>Cornish Saints are considered to be 'sacred' and 'holy'.</li> <li>St. Piran is the patron saint of Cornwall.</li> </ul>
	Summer 2 – Faith Community	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Belonging means having a secure connection.</li> <li>Different religions have different symbols of belonging.</li> <li>A community is a group of people that values each other.</li> <li>A welcoming ceremony is how births are celebrated.</li> </ul>
<u>Year 3</u>	Autumn 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Christians believe God created the world.</li> <li>When Adam and Eve ate the apple from the tree of knowledge, 'sin' entered the world.</li> <li>Christians pray to God to say sorry and ask forgiveness.</li> </ul>
	Autumn 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>God flooded the world.</li> <li>Noah built an ark and was saved from the floods.</li> <li>God made a promise to Noah not to flood the Earth again.</li> <li>Christians make promises to each other when they get married.</li> <li>A covenant is a promise.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There are stories that show Jesus' teachings in the Bible.</li> <li>Christian churches support their communities by offering provisions or services.</li> <li>Jesus treated all people with compassion and kindness.</li> <li>Gospel means good news and include stories about Jesus.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There is only one God in Islam.</li> </ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ibadah means worship of Islam.</li> <li>• Muslims worship through fasting, praying and celebrating festivals.</li> <li>• Submission and self-control are important to Muslims.</li> </ul>
	Summer 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shabbat is the Jewish day of starting at sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday.</li> <li>• Rosh Hashana is the Jewish new year, celebrated at a different time to the Christian new year.</li> <li>• Yom Kippur is the holiest day in the Jewish calendar.</li> <li>• Exodus tells the story of Moses leading the Jews out of Egypt.</li> <li>• A seder plate helps remember the Passover story.</li> <li>• Jews follow the ten commandments.</li> </ul>
	Summer 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jews, Christians and Muslims practise their beliefs in a variety of ways.</li> </ul>
<u>Year 4</u>	Autumn 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Water is a Christian symbol.</li> <li>• A Gospel is a life-story or biography of the life and teachings of Jesus.</li> <li>• The Trinity is the father, son and Holy Spirit.</li> <li>• Christians are baptised and through this believe that God is all around them.</li> </ul>
	Autumn 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know the three deities Vishnu, Shiva and Brahma.</li> <li>• A 'Murti' is a statue, idol or image of a Hindu deity.</li> <li>• Piya is a Hindu shrine at home.</li> <li>• Hindus worship at a shrine.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dharma is about goodness, truth and duty.</li> <li>• Hindus attend daily piya, arti ceremonies, visit temples and read holy texts.</li> <li>• Diwali is the Hindu festival of light.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Palm Sunday was the day Jesus went to Jerusalem.</li> <li>• Good Friday was the day of crucifixion.</li> <li>• Easter Sunday was the day of resurrection.</li> <li>• Jesus was betrayed by Judas.</li> </ul>
	Summer 1 - Pentecost	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Pentecost is a celebrated 50 days after Easter.</li> <li>• The Pentecost was when the Holy Spirit appeared to the disciples.</li> <li>• The Pentecost represents the beginning of the Christian church.</li> </ul>
	Summer 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Saint Piran is a Cornish Saint.</li> <li>• Cornwall has unique festivals, like Mazey Day, Trevithick Day, Flora Day and St Day Feast.</li> </ul>
<u>Year 5</u>	Autumn 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know the Torah is used weekly in the Synagogue and how it is produced, covered and treated.</li> </ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know the Jewish community today still follow the commandments from the Torah.</li> <li>• Know what the kosher food laws are and that many Jewish people follow them.</li> <li>• Know not all Jews follow the same laws (Orthodox and progressive Jewish practice).</li> </ul>
	Autumn 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Christians believe Jesus is 'God in the flesh' which is one of the three trinity.</li> <li>• Christians hoped for 'Messiah' to heal the world from sin and Jesus' name.</li> <li>• Know why Christians believed the world needed a saviour.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Know the different parts of a Cathedral and how they express ideas about God.</li> <li>• Christians believe God is holy and loving.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Christians follow the commandments and Jesus' words as their foundations of living.</li> <li>• Know how Christians show forgiveness and generosity.</li> </ul>
	Summer 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Muslims follow five pillars.</li> <li>• The Qur'an is the Muslims guidance foe fife and they put words into practice.</li> <li>• Know the purpose of a Mosque and how it's designed.</li> </ul>
	Summer 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Humanists are a group of non-religious people.</li> <li>• Know some Humanists follow a moral code, so they do 'good without God'.</li> <li>• Know the Humanist 'code for living'.</li> </ul>
<u>Year 6</u>	Autumn 1 – Creation and science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are different interpretations of what Genesis 1 means.</li> <li>• Many Christians believe that science and faith go together.</li> <li>• Cosmologists believe the Universe began with the Big Bang.</li> <li>• Evolution is the development of the human being.</li> </ul>
	Autumn 2 – Why do some people believe in God, and some do not?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A Theist is a person who believes in God.</li> <li>• An Atheist does not believe in God.</li> <li>• An Agnostic believes that the existence of God is unknown.</li> </ul>
	Spring 1 - For Christians, what kind of king is Christmas?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jesus is not seen as a royal king but as the saviour of mankind.</li> <li>• Christians try to make the world a better place.</li> <li>• Parables are a story in the Bible with a message.</li> </ul>
	Spring 2 – What do Christians believe Jesus did to save people?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Christians believe that Jesus' death was a sacrifice.</li> <li>• Christians believe many people were responsible for Jesus' death.</li> <li>• Bread symbolises Jesus' body and wine his blood.</li> </ul>

	Summer 1 – Why do Hindus want to be good?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Braham is the source of all existence and is present in everything and every place.</li><li>• Karma is the law of cause and effect.</li><li>• Samsara is the cycle of life, death and rebirth.</li></ul>
	Summer 2 – Does faith help people in Cornwall when life gets hard?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• There are many spiritual sites in Cornwall (St Piran).</li><li>• John Wesley was the leader of Methodism.</li><li>• Methodists believe that people should have a very personal relationship with God that transforms their lives.</li></ul>
