<u>Timings of the School Day (Reception - Year 6)</u>

As you will be aware from communication in the summer term and the letter sent to parents/carers earlier this week via the school texting service, in line with government guidance, we have extended our school day by ten minutes. This means we start 5 minutes earlier and finish 5 minutes later. Therefore parents/carers who arrive after 8.50am will have to sign their children in as late at main reception. While the lower gate is still open, this

is for nursery and preschool children only. We cannot let older children through as the doors to the main building are closed due to safeguarding and fire registers.

In KS1, where children are with their parents/carers, we ask that parents remind their children of this and in KS2 we have staff outside reminding the older children.

Mobile Phones/Smart Watches

This year many of our older children are bringing phones into school with them. We kindly ask that only children who come to or walk from school without an adult bring



their phone. We understand that these children need their phones as part of keeping them safe. Those children who are accompanied do not need their phone in school and as such please do double check, they have left theirs at home. Phones are collected by staff at the start of the day and kept in locked cupboards as part of school safeguarding. The school does not accept any responsibility for damage to phones while at school.






